Coronavirus Symptoms

A new consistent or continuous cough
A high temperature (above 37.5 degrees)
A loss/change of taste and/or smell

Area of Concern	Measures in place to limit risk
<p>Reduce congestion: Busy school site with crowds at start / end of day</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Drop off and pick up for all children will be outside their own classrooms ● DO NOT wait around after drop off or pick up; leave the site quickly - to avoid congestion ● Face masks are not compulsory outdoors, but we do encourage everyone to wear one when entering enclosed spaces, however this is personal choice. ● No scooters/bikes allowed on school site; parents must carry/walk scooters once inside school gates
<p>Transmission from person to person: People with symptoms of COVID-19 / developing symptoms whilst at school</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● DO NOT give your child Calpol/cough mixture if they have a high temperature/cough and then bring them in to school ● Classroom windows (high level where possible) are kept open for ventilation. CO2 monitors are now in use in all classrooms to monitor air quality. ● Staff and visitors are encouraged to wear masks in enclosed spaces, but this is personal choice. ● Staff to wear PPE when administering personal care and/or first aid for symptomatic children ● Any child developing COVID symptoms whilst at school will be sent home immediately and PCR testing is required straight away ● In the case of a confirmed positive case, we strongly recommend the individual isolates for 5 full days. They can then take 2 Lateral Flow tests (24 hours apart) on Day 5 and 6. If both tests are negative, they may come out of isolation on Day 6 and return to school. If the Lateral Flow tests are positive, you can keep doing daily Lateral Flow tests and you must have 2 negative results, 24 hours apart, to finish isolation early. ● Child's test results must be shared with the school immediately via admin@burlingtoni.org.uk Booking a test
<p>Classrooms</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● On arriving at school, all children wash hands or use hand sanitiser

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ●Children use the same classroom or area of a setting throughout the day, with a thorough cleaning of the rooms at the end of the day/session ●PE lessons may take place inside and outside. Equipment and apparatus must be wiped down after use ●Singing may resume inside; rooms must be well ventilated
Contaminated surfaces: Use of shared equipment, e.g. toys, pens, books	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ●All staff and children are reminded to wash their hands regularly during the day, especially before eating, and drinking and to avoid touching their nose, mouth or eyes ●All water fountains have been switched off; children to bring in water bottles instead ●Keyboards and mice in ICT room are cleaned after each use / session ●Clean/sanitise resources between sessions in nursery ●Thorough cleaning of surfaces in classrooms at the end of each day ●Toilets and taps cleaned twice each day - before school and at lunchtime ●Other high-use surfaces (e.g. door handles) cleaned 2 x per day
Lunchtime	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ●Children sit in class groups and may now be seated facing each other. After clearing away their plates, children return to tables to wait for their class to leave the hall. ●Year 1 and 2 will consume lunches in the Great Hall at the same time ●Tables, toilets / sinks cleaned after each sitting ●Each class has its own cutlery tray
Local lockdown or outbreak in the school	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ●School will follow the advice provided by Public Health England and RBK (Local Authority) in these situations ●School regularly checks latest Government advice
Clinically vulnerable: Some pupils / staff may be more vulnerable to complications associated with COVID-19	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ●Read the current advice on shielding (updated on 24/12/21) ●If required, individual risk assessments to be put in place for children/staff falling under the category of clinically extremely vulnerable.
Lack of knowledge / awareness amongst school community: Communication	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ●Parents informed of any changes, updates and reminders to COVID procedures through Friday e-newsletters, emails from the School office and the School website (see here) ●School regularly checks latest Government advice, and Local Authority updates
Acorns Breakfast and After School Club	All the above measures are applicable to our wraparound childcare provision. In addition to the above: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ●Parents stay outside to drop off / collect their children ●Regular handwashing and hand sanitising through sessions ●Increased outside play ●All equipment and furniture is cleaned at the end of each session ●Toilets checked before every after school club
