Reduce congestion: Busy school site with crowds at start / end of day	<ul> <li>Drop off and pick up for all children will be outside their own classrooms</li> <li>DO NOT wait around after drop off or pick up; leave the site quickly - to avoid congestion</li> <li>Face masks are not compulsory outdoors, but when entering the school building, or enclosed/crowded spaces, a face covering should be worn</li> <li>No scooters/bikes allowed on school site; parents must carry/walk scooters once inside school gates</li> </ul>
Transmission from person to person: People with symptoms of COVID-19 / developing symptoms whilst at school	<ul> <li>DO NOT enter school grounds if you have any Covid-19 symptoms.</li> <li>DO NOT give your child Calpol/cough mixture if they have a high temperature/cough and then bring them in to school</li> <li>Classroom windows (high level where possible) are kept open for ventilation. CO2 monitors are now in use in all classrooms to monitor air quality.</li> <li>Staff and visitors to wear masks in all communal areas</li> <li>A face visor or shield may be worn in addition to a face covering but not instead of one. This is because face visors or shields do not adequately cover the nose and mouth, and do not filter airborne particles.</li> <li>Staff to wear PPE when administering personal care and/or first aid for symptomatic children</li> <li>All staff to use lateral flow home testing kits 2x / week to avoid asymptomatic transmission</li> <li>Parents are able to collect lateral flow (rapid response) home testing kits from test centres for asymptomatic testing and/or pharmacies etc., or by ordering online, for use by their household (for further guidance, see here)</li> <li>Any child developing symptoms whilst at school will be sent home immediately and PCR testing is required</li> </ul>

	taken on Day 6 and 7, the infected person must continue to isolate for 10 days.  In the case of a confirmed positive case, children and fully vaccinated adults who are 'close contacts' (in the same class), will be asked to take a PCR test immediately; they will not need to self-isolate while awaiting the results of the test. If the PCR test is positive, they will be required to self-isolate for 7 days from the date of the test (see bullet point above). If the PCR test is negative, they will be strongly advised to take a daily Lateral Flow test for 7 days, and can continue to come to school as long as the test results remain negative.  Close contacts of adults who have been tested positive will be contacted by track and trace. Where possible, staff will inform colleagues and any close contacts so that they can arrange a PCR test straight away.  Child's test results must be shared with the school immediately

Classrooms	<ul> <li>On arriving at school, all children wash hands or use hand sanitiser</li> <li>Children use the same classroom or area of a setting throughout the day, with a thorough cleaning of the rooms at the end of the day/session</li> <li>PE lessons may take place inside and outside. Equipment and apparatus must be wiped down after use</li> <li>Singing may resume inside; rooms must be well ventilated</li> </ul>
Contaminated surfaces: Use of shared equipment, e.g. toys, pens, books	<ul> <li>All staff and children are reminded to wash their hands regularly during the day, especially before eating, and drinking and to avoid touching their nose, mouth or eyes</li> <li>All water fountains have been switched off; children to bring in water bottles instead</li> <li>Keyboards and mice in ICT room are cleaned after each use / session</li> <li>Clean/sanitise resources between sessions in nursery</li> <li>Thorough cleaning of surfaces in classrooms at the end of each day</li> <li>Toilets and taps cleaned twice each day - before school and at lunchtime</li> <li>Other high-use surfaces (e.g. door handles) cleaned 2 x per day</li> </ul>
Lunchtime	<ul> <li>Children sit in class groups and may now be seated facing each other. After clearing away their plates, children return to tables to wait for their class to leave the hall.</li> <li>Year 1 and 2 will consume lunches in the Great Hall at the same time</li> <li>Tables, toilets / sinks cleaned after each sitting</li> <li>Each class has its own cutlery tray</li> </ul>
Local lockdown or outbreak in the school	School will follow the advice provided by Public Health England and RBK (Local Authority) in these situations     School regularly checks latest Government advice
