Coronavirus (COVID-19) catch-up premium

At Burlington we are using the government 'catch up' funding to support children to address the gaps in learning as a result of lockdown. Our aims for 'catch up' include:

- Supporting mental health of children
- Narrowing the gaps in attainment (YR to Y2)
- Supporting the development of language in EYFS

The school will receive £28,000 for the year to support this targeted work. The following table shows how we are using this money:
