Scotland's Landscape

Scotland has highlands, lowlands, coastline, islands, rivers, mountains and lochs.



Scotland's Physical Landscape

Scotland has **highlands** with **mountains** and **glens**, and **lowlands** with **hills** and **farmland**.

Scotland also has a large **coastline**, lots of **rivers** and **lochs** and nearly 800 **islands**.

Edinburgh Castle

A historic fortress in Scotland's capital city, Edinburgh.

The fortress sits on the top of Castle Rock.

Loch Ness

A deep, freshwater loch in the Scottish Highlands. It is the second largest loch in Scotland.

Loch Ness is famous for its legend of the Loch Ness Monster.



Scotland's Physical Landscape



Ben Nevis

The highest mountain in the British Isles. Ben Nevis is 1,345 m tall, and is located in the Grampian Mountains, in the Scottish Highlands.

Holyrood Palace

The official residence for the British monarch in Scotland. The Queen visits Holyrood Palace for a week every summer.




You could design your own **tartan**.
