Lesson 1 - Making a clock and telling the time to the hour.


You will need a paper plate, paper or card, scissors and a split pin/paper clip.










Can you make your own clock out of card or a paper? You could use the template on the next slides. You will need a split pin or paper clip.








Hours and Minutes

This is the hour hand.


This is the **minute** hand.

It is the shortest hand on the clock.

It is longer than the hour hand.




When the minute hand is pointing to 12, it is showing a full hour. We call this time 'o'clock'.




On this clock, the hour hand is pointing at the 8 and the minute hand is pointing to the 12.

This clock is showing that the time is **8 o'clock**.




I know that because the long hand is pointing at the 12 and the short hand is pointing at the 7.



It is 3 o'clock.

I know that because the long hand is pointing at the 12 and the short hand is pointing at the




It is 11 o'clock.

I know that because the long hand is pointing at the 12 and the short hand is pointing at the 11.







A clock face is a full circle which is made up of 2 halves.



How many minutes make up half of an hour?









Look at this time.

The big hand is pointing at 6, which is halfway around the clock.


Where is the small hand pointing? Is it on the number?

It's half way between 1 and 2.







Which clock is showing half past 2? Which clock is showing half past 9? Which clock is showing half past 7?
