# Prime Areas of Learning

### Personal, Social, Emotional Development

Having increasing support to be independent in self-care. Learning to include our friends in our play and learning to negotiate

Gain understand what it means to feel proud and talk about

things that make us feel proud in our learning
Children encouraged to be motivated to try and 'have a go'
Children to begin to understand what it means to concentrate,
be attentive and listen well in their learning.
Children to begin to understand what 'target' means.
Talking to children about setting a class target and encouraging
children to work towards this and to know when it is reached

#### Communication and Language

Role play - linked to children's interests
Sharing Traditional stories- Jack and the Beanstalk
Nursery rhymes- Rhyme time challenge
Maths rhymes- 10 in the bed, 5 little current buns in the
bakers shop, 10 fat sausages, 5 little monkeys
Talking about the environment and the natural world and
modelling new vocabulary

Information texts about colours in nature
Becoming increasingly able to communicate own ideas,
experiences and views clearly and with a growing vocabulary

## Physical Development

Mark making - making different patterns in malleable materials, forming the letters in name, attempting 'brave writing' using letter shapes

Knowing the importance of flushing the toilet and wash hands, looking after own property, recognising when feeling hot / cold / tired

Using equipment to climb and balance, being brave and confident

Controlling large balls - throw, catch, kick

Big arm movements in outdoor play – big chalks on the floor, using a range of brushes and rollers, scarves

Continue daily physical activity at 'hello time' at the start of each session. Developing fine motor movement - funky finger activities, tweezer activities, threading, beads, pompoms etc.
