




Nursery expectations

On starting Nursery, I will:

1. Go to the toilet, flush the chain and wash my hands independently.




Most children are toilet trained (through the day) by age 3, becoming dry through the night between the ages of 3 and 4. They should also be able to wipe themselves and pull up their own pants.



2. Leave my **dummy** at home.

Health professionals recommend that by age 3 children should **no longer be using a dummy, sucking a thumb or drinking from a bottle.** They recommend children drink from a cup. Continued use of dummies/ bottles or thumb sucking can and does affect children's speech development.



3. Put my **coat on and take my coat off independently**



Zips may be easier and quicker for young children to manage.



4. I can put my shoes on and take them off.




Choose shoes that slip on or fasten with Velcro rather than laces as these are often easier for children to manage on their own.

5. I can drink from a cup



Let your child practice drinking from a cup without a lid, only pour small amounts at a time to avoid spills.



6. I can blow my own **nose** and then put the tissue **in the bin**.



Show your child how to blow and wipe their nose, throw the tissue in the bin

7. I will always show **kind hands and kind feet** to my teachers and peers



Personal, Social and Emotional Development

The children will be learning to:



- become self-confident;
- have awareness of their own feelings and feelings of others;
- take an interest in things;
- become independent;
- tell the difference between right and wrong.



Communication and Language

The children will be learning to:




- talk confidently and clearly;
- show awareness of the listener;
- enjoy listening to stories, songs and poems, show good attention;
- follow instructions;
- answer questions about stories



Physical Development


The children will be learning to:


- move confidently;
- control their body;
- handle equipment;
- manage their own basic hygiene and personal needs including dressing and undressing independently.



Following Progress

- Every child is **monitored daily** through their **adult led work, child initiated play and observations**.
- Every child in Nursery has a **key worker** who takes responsibility for identifying their children's daily learning and progress.
- Parent and teacher dialogue and parent consultations in October and February.


Tapestry

- Please complete a form so we can give you access (can be one or both parents)
- Respond to an invite by email and download the Tapestry App.
- You will receive posts with photos and commentary about what your child is doing in Nursery.
- You can respond by 'likes' or writing a response.
- You can send your key worker messages on Tapestry.
- We use it in 'lockdown' to post videos of us teaching lessons and to communicate with you.



On my first day I will need...

- Simple clothes that I can pull up/down on my own. Weather appropriate.
- Clothes that are not precious because it is likely I will get dirty or wet.
- A named bag of spare clothes that can be kept on my peg.
- Sensible shoes (no open toe sandals or flip-flops)
- A Burlington Infants and Nursery School Book bag so I can borrow books from school.

Coronavirus...

- Please line up **2m apart** at drop off and pick up.
- Every child will be given **hand gel** before and after they enter the Nursery.
- If your child has any of the **symptoms** of Covid-19 please keep them off school and get a test, letting us know the results straight away.
- If we have a positive test and need to close the Nursery we will let you know straight away. Learning will then be moved to **Tapestry**.




Nursery parent expectations

- Please arrive and collect your child **on time:**
8.30am to 8.45 - 11.15am to 11.30am
12.30pm to 12.45pm - 3.15pm to 3.30pm
- Make sure your child has eaten a good **breakfast or lunch** before Nursery.
- Make sure your child has had a full night's sleep.
7pm bedtime is advised by professionals.
- Make sure we know who is **collecting** your child.



Full Time places and Lunch Club

- **FT Funded places to support working parents**
 - Eligibility Criteria - parents earning between £6,000 - £100,000
 - FT = Monday - Friday 8:30 - 3:30
 - Includes a Lunch Club charged at £8.50 per session
- **FT Paid places (as currently offered)**
 - £26 per session - includes Lunch Club
- **Lunch Club - 11:30 - 12:30**
 - Healthy cooked meal
 - Flexible extended provision (Acorns) - can select days
