







Welcome to Year One

Familiar Activities during Transition


- Learning Environment – book corner, role play area, construction, sand/water, painting...


Phonics

- speaks your language at home.



What can I do at home?

- Talk about their day – “what was your favourite thing at school today?”
- Reading – as much as possible
- Maths games and rhymes
- Spellings – tested weekly
- Games:
dice games, I-spy, pretend play, shopping
- Writing at home:
shopping lists, diaries, emails to family members, letters, stories
- Asking your child what they have in their book bag. Is there anything they need for tomorrow?
- Weekly writing ‘Inspiration Station’ and ‘Picture News’ challenges will soon start.


