- Make your own bingo boards using number facts (addition/subtraction) (A bingo game can also be found on ICT Games website- see above)
- Play traditional board games with family members- Snakes and Ladders, Orchard games etc
- Cooking- help to measure/weigh ingredients
- Sing number songs e.g. Five currant buns (BBC School Radio- counting songs <u>https://www.bbc.co.uk/programmes/p065s47t</u>)
- Building- when using construction items at home, ask what shapes have been used and why? (This will encourage 3D shape language)



Other ideas:

- Communication and Language
 - Talk about Spring and the changes that can be seen- blossom, flowers growing, new animals etc.
- Personal, Social and Emotional
 - Share stories
 - Make food together e.g. cakes, bread, fruit salad
 - Ask children to help tidy up the house and take responsibility for chores \odot
- Physical Development
 - Cosmic Kids Yoga is a great place to find yoga videos for children (and adults) to try. Video lengths vary and contain modern themes e.g. Moana and Pokemon (<u>https://www.cosmickids.com/</u>)
 - Make your own playdough and get the children to squash and squeeze it https://theimaginationtree.com/best-ever-no-cook-play-dough-recipe/
 - Play Musical Statues
- Creative
 - Painting/drawing pictures of Spring
 - Make props/puppets for your favourite story and act it out together
