School Uniform Policy

Statement of Intent

Burlington Infant School is committed to promoting equality and value for money, and to ensuring that no pupil is discriminated against due to their religion or belief, economic circumstances or social and cultural background – this policy contains provisions to meet these objectives. This policy has been created with health and safety, value for money and practicality at its heart. It has been designed to ensure pupils wear clothing conducive to a successful learning environment. It is important that our pupils feel a sense of belonging and community through a smart and practical uniform. We believe a uniform allows all pupils, regardless of background, to feel equal to their peers and confident in their appearance. We also believe it is important for school activities to be facilitated by specialised and appropriate clothing such as sports-specific attire.

All our Parents and Carers should ensure that their children are dressed in the correct school uniform, which encourages a sense of pride and belonging to Burlington Infant School.

All children from Reception to Year 2 are expected to wear the following items:

Winter

Royal blue sweatshirt/cardigan with logo
White polo shirt without logo
Grey trousers/grey skirt/grey pinafore dress
Flat black school shoes (no trainers). Please note boots may be worn in wet weather, but children must change into black school shoes when entering the classroom.
Plain black/grey/white socks or tights
Plain blue, white or black hairbands and hair ties

Summer - additional items

Blue and white checked dress
Grey shorts
Sun hat or cap during hot weather

Plain black trainers or black plimsolls

Grey/Navy or Black jogging bottoms, hoodie, sweatshirt

Plain white t-shirt (round neck)

Plain Navy or black shorts

Please note:

- Jewellery is not permitted. However, small stud earrings may be worn.
- All items must be clearly marked with your child's name.
- Nail varnish is not permitted. We will ask children to remove it with the help of an adult.
- Long hair (shoulder length or longer) must be tied back. A plain Alice band is allowed for shorter hair. Hair must not fall in front of a child's face when they are working.

Cultural, Race and Religious Requirements

At Burlington Infant School we respect the needs of our school community with regards to race, religion, culture and gender identity. We accommodate these needs within the uniform policy and are happy for children to dress appropriately to reflect this (providing that it does not pose a threat to security, safety and learning, or compromise the well-being of the whole school community). We request that children wear plain blue, black or white hijabs.

<u>Availability</u>

The school uniform is available from the PMG Schoolwear shop in Chessington. Other general uniform items are available from any leading chain store. We try to ensure that uniform costs are kept low by offering the majority of our uniform at major shops. Second hand uniform is also available from the school office for a small donation.

Monitoring

The Senior Leadership Team monitors the implementation of this policy to ensure that all children wear the correct school uniform including the correct school shoes. Parents/Carers are contacted if children are not consistently in school uniform and appropriate support is offered if applicable.
