MATHS

Throughout the week we are using a resource from the White Rose Maths Hub. They provide high quality teaching videos which we feel will support the children's learning and also help them to

work more independently. The videos come with designated activity sheets. We have used these in our slides however some parents might wish for their child to complete these. The activity sheets can be printed off however this is optional.

The slides have been prepared and should be viewed as a presentation. The children can record their work in their own way on paper. For some of the activities they may choose to use objects around the house to help them.

Maths lesson 1 10 times table

In this lesson children will revisit and revise the ten times table. They will learn that to multiply by ten means numbers become ten times bigger. They will also practise using the bar model to solve and represent multiplication problems. There is an optional activity sheet.

Maths Lesson 2 Division as sharing

In this lesson the children will revisit and revise that division is sharing a number equally. They will learn what equal and unequal means and how to write division calculations using the division symbol. There is an optional activity sheet.

Maths lesson 3 Division as grouping

Yesterday we looked at sharing in division. Today we are going to look at division as grouping. The children will look at examples with real life objects first, then show this as a division sentence. During this lesson the children will learn to use a number line for division, something we did a bit of at school.

Maths lesson 4 Odd and even numbers

In this lesson the children will recap odd and even numbers.

They will use grouping to help recognise when a number is odd or even and then solve problems using what they have learnt about odd and even numbers.

Maths lesson 5

In this lesson we would like the children to create a maths game that helps them to revise multiplication and division facts. There are examples given on the slides for example, there are flashcard games and track games. It would be lovely to see a photograph of the children playing the game they have created.

Mental Maths

- to add and subtract 2 2-digit numbers mentally. To extend children who are ready they could solve problems that require exchanging e.g., 34 + 57 and 54 35
- to quickly add 'near doubles' eg, 5+6 = 5+5+1 = 11

ENGLISH

Lesson 1: Golden Words and -ly suffix

Golden Words for this week: money, poor, water, behind, because, only

-ly suffix: The children will recap that sometimes we can just add -ly e.g. quick \rightarrow quickly and sometimes we have to change the y \rightarrow i e.g. happy \rightarrow happily

Lesson 2: Reading Comprehension

The Lonely Beast by Chris Judge

Read through the story and answer the questions on the slides.

Lesson 3: Expanded Noun Phrases

Writing expanded noun phrases to describe the animals The Lonely Beast meets in the sea.

There is sheet for the children to record their expanded noun phrases on.

Lesson 4: Write

Children will use their expanded noun phrases and suffixes to re-write the part of the story when The Lonely Beast walks along the bottom of the sea.

Lesson 5: Continue writing, read over, check and improve writing

Suggested piece to be uploaded

Children will read through Mrs MacMillan's piece of writing and check it for good mistakes. Then they will read over their own work to check it, and also try to improve it.

Mr Johnson's PE Challenge - Jumping Jacks!

Give this workout a go every morning before you start your home learning, this week it's all about jumps and hops!

Jumping Jacks: stretch arms and legs out to the side like a starfish while jumping, return arms to sides and legs to centre on landing

Tuck Jumps: bend knees and lift heels high while jumping

Hurdle Hops: jump side-to-side or front-to-back over pretend hurdle

One-Foot Hops: lift one knee and jump on standing leg; alternate (this is a great balance challenge too!)

Criss-Cross Feet: jump straight up, then cross one foot in front of the other; on next jump, switch feet and continue
