Overview

This week we are asking the children to write a description about an imaginary world they might discover at the top of a magical tree. This lesson will be completed in school. All home learning children should complete this at home.

In school the children will be creating their own imaginary world in Art before beginning this writing. At home they could either do the Art lesson first (please see google classroom) or just look at the pictures in the Art lesson to inspire their writing (thumbnails have been included in this lesson too).

We will plan the writing first and use the plan to support structuring sentences. Some children might write a description of what they can see when they visit their world, whilst some might continue their writing into a story about what happens when they are there.




Today we are going to write about our magical world at the top of the tree.

What can you hear? What can you smell?





As I emerged from the clouds at the top of the tree I saw...

A plan can help us with our writing. Let's make one now.


<p>What is your magical land called?</p>

giant lollipops purple candy floss clouds excited	


At the top of the tree I arrived in **Lollipop Land!** There were **giant lollipops** and **purple candy floss clouds**. I felt **excited**.

Adjectives are words that add description. They are like magic paintbrushes in our minds!




Close your eyes and listen to this description of Lollipop Land!
