English - Around the World week quiz

This week should have been 'Around the World' week at school where we pick a country for our class and learn all about it. We do lots of fun activities such as cooking, dancing and making crafts from that country. We would like you to choose a country, maybe somewhere special for your family, where you have come from, been on holiday to or somewhere you are interested in! Your teachers have made up a quiz about their chosen country - have fun watching the videos! We would like you to send us a photo of you making some traditional food or craft from your country or make us a quiz about it and send us it to see if we can answer the questions!

Topic - Bear Quiz

This is our final week on the Bears topic. We review the bears we have already learned about and there is an optional activity to make a Bear Top Trumps game or a poster. On google classroom you will also find a short, multiple-choice quiz, that we would like the children to complete. There is a BBC programme to watch called 'Meet the Bears' and Mrs Davies reads you a story aboyt a Koala. Is a Koala a Bear?

Outdoor Learning Day

This week we would like to ask you to go on a short walk in your local area. While on your walk you can make notes of what you can see. We are asking children to use their notes to draw a map, using a key, and challenging them to use a compass.

Handwriting, Reading, Phonics, Spelling and Grammar

- 1. Reading: Books on Bug Club
- 2. Handwriting: writing tongue twisters from Letterjoin for your family to do!
- 3. Spelling: revisit all the Year 1 tricky words and notice spelling patterns.
- 4. Phonics: revising using the alternative spellings for the 'or' phoneme
- 5. Grammar: learning how to use question marks. This will be helpful for writing your quiz.

We would like to see that you have been Reading and playing the sentence game on Active Learn Primary please. We can check this by logging on ourselves. Resources needed - paper, pencil and your letterjoin and Active Learn Primary logins.

Maths

This week in maths we are moving on from last week's halving and will be looking at quartering both shapes and numbers. There are lots of small optional tasks where you can have fun drawing lines over shapes to try and cut them into quarters or you could even draw your own shapes and ask an adult to help you cut them. We would also love to see your challenges of quartering numbers. This is in lesson 3 where you will discover an easy way to quarter numbers. For this challenge you could use counters or any small toys or you can simply draw the counters on like we have on the slides. It is up to you!

After that there are some more fun problem solving challenges to look at and some quick mental maths addition and subtraction questions. Enjoy!
