# Year 1 Week 3 Summer Term - commencing 4th May 2020 Home Learning Overview

## Dear Year 1

We hope you have enjoyed using your Google classrooms this week. Thank you for all the photos and videos you have sent us and for all the effort with supporting learning at home. We really appreciate it! And love all the pictures, videos and work! Although we are delighted to see all the work you are doing please remember to **only do what you can and you do not have to do it all**. As a minimum each week there is one maths activity, one english activity and reading we need to see. This week it is a photo or picture of you sharing objects in maths, to complete the game on 'Grammar and Spelling Bug' using -est and -er suffixes and to see you reading on 'Bug Club'.

We are aware some families have had issues with accessing Google classroom - please ensure you are using your child's Google account. (If there are multiple google users sharing a laptop or computer it can be helpful to have multiple browser tabs open to save logging each time. If using the Google classroom app on a smartphone you are able to select which account you are logging in with when opening the app.)

This week we are learning about pandas. There are lots of fun videos to watch and activities you can do.

## **English and Topic**

Use the slides to research all about pandas. There are videos linked in the slides that will help you. We have shared two teaching videos - one with Mrs Ridley and one with Mrs Davies - to help you further. There is an OPTIONAL activity to create a panda board game using the facts you have learned. If you do make a game we would love to see it so please share photos in your Google Classroom. Have fun!

Resources needed - paper, pencil, felt tips or colour pencils (maybe also scissors, card, the back of a cereal box, a dice and objects to use as counters).

## Handwriting, Reading, Phonics, Spelling and Grammar

- 1. Reading: Books on Bug Club
- 2. Handwriting: practise writing numbers correctly
- 3. Spelling: spelling tricky words
- 4. Phonics: revising using the ear, ere and eer phonemes
- 5. Grammar: learning how to use the suffixes -er and -est at the end of words to compare objects by listening to Mrs. Davies describe Smiley Shark and playing a game on Spelling and Grammar bug.

*We would like to see that you have been Reading and playing the suffix game on Active Learn Primary please. We can check this by logging on ourselves. Resources needed - paper, pencil and your letterjoin and Active Learn Primary logins.* 



Maths

This week we are looking at sharing and grouping, this is an introduction to division, <u>but we</u> <u>don't use the word division</u>, or the division symbol yet. The children will look at how to group and share items and then use these skills to solve some problems.

This week we would like to see a photo of the activity from lesson 3 (it is indicated with a camera picture). Mrs Davies has made a video to help you with this. All other tasks can either be done on the slides or on orange books and you can share them with us if you want to.

Resources needed for the week are counters (You can use grapes, peas, coins, cut up pieces of paper, sweets...)
