Spring Term

Our topic this half term is: Chocolate

Welcome back! We hope you all had a lovely break and are ready to start the next half term! Charlie and the Chocolate Factory is one of Roald Dahl's best-known children's books and this term we are going to use it to help with our learning.

Below is an outline of what the children will be learning about:

English

- Book Week. This year our focus is poetry and in particular, reciting and performing a poem.
- Class Text: Charlie and the Chocolate Factory
- Author study Roald
 Dahl
- Poetry Mnemonic poems
- Capital letters, full stops, exclamation marks, question marks
- Suffixes ment, -ness,
 -ly, -ful, -less
- Contractions e.g. didn't, couldn't
- Editing our writing using the 5 checks

<u>Maths</u>

- <u>Position and Direction</u> clockwise, anti-clockwise, right angles, quarter turn, half turn, three quarter turn
- Telling the Time o'clock, half past, quarter to, quarter past, telling the time to the nearest 5 minutes
- Addition e.g. 23 + 5, 46 + 20, 24 + 21, 48+35, showing their thinking in their own way e.g. verbally, in pictures, using dienes, bar model, numicon, empty number lines etc
- <u>Subtraction</u> e.g. 16-5, 88-30, 54 - 23, 72-17, showing their thinking in their own way e.g. verbally, in pictures, using dienes, bar model, numicon, empty number lines etc
- <u>Scales</u> read scales in division of ones, twos, fives and tens.

Science

- Sorting objects into living, once living, has never lived and explain their thinking
- Charlie's Chocolate
 Factory Sweet Science
 experiments

Computing - Programming

- Learn to create and debug algorithms
- Use the basic commands in Logo to move and draw using the turtle on screen
- Develop algorithms using the "repeat" command
- Create algorithms in Scratch using a selection of blocks.

- Use an atlas/look at a world map with your child.
- Practise counting in 2s, 5s and 10s with your children and ask them 2x, 5x and 10x table
- Practise telling the time o'clock, half past, quarter to/past and to the nearest 5 minutes.
- Encourage your child to take part in our Sponsored Read The Big Booky Bedtime, the optional Science homework, Inspiration Station, Picture News and Monthly Maths Challenge.
