Our topic this half term is: Fabulous Food

Welcome back! We hope you all had a lovely break and are ready to start the next half term!

Below is an outline of what the children will be learning about:

English

- Book Week focus is poetry.
- Key Text: Hansel and Gretel by Bethan Woollvin
- Capital letters, full stops, exclamation marks, question marks
- Suffixes ment, -ness, -ly,
 -ful, -less
- Contractions e.g. didn't, couldn't
- Editing our writing using the 5 checks

Maths

- <u>Position and Direction</u> clockwise, anti-clockwise, right angles, quarter turn, half turn, three quarter turn
- <u>Telling the Time</u> o'clock, half past, quarter to, quarter past, telling the time to the nearest 5 minutes
- Addition e.g. 23 + 5, 46 + 20, 24 + 21, 48+35, showing their thinking in their own way e.g. verbally, in pictures, using dienes, bar model, numicon, empty number lines etc
- <u>Subtraction</u> e.g. 16-5, 88-30,
 54 23, 72-17, showing their thinking in their own way e.g. verbally, in pictures, using dienes, bar model, numicon, empty number lines etc
- <u>Scales</u> read scales in division of ones, twos, fives and tens.

Science

- Sorting objects into living, once living, has never lived and explain their thinking
- Food chains
- Key Scientist Dr Parvez Alam, a senior lecturer in materials at the University of Edinburgh

<u>Computing - Data</u> <u>Information</u>

- Counting and Comparing
- Enter the Data
- Creating pictograms
- What is an Attribute?
- Presenting information using a block diagram.

<u>Geography</u>

 Comparing the human and physical features of Rio and London including landmark buildings, highest points, famous buildings, longest rivers and leaders

- Painting layering paint to create highlights and shadows.

- Practise telling the time o'clock, half past, quarter to/past and to the nearest 5 minutes.
- Encourage your child to take part in our Sponsored Read, Monthly Maths Challenge, the optional Science homework, Inspiration Station and Picture News.
