MATHS

Throughout the week we are using a new resource from the White Rose Maths Hub. They provide high quality teaching videos which we feel will support the children's learning and also help them to work more independently. The videos come with designated activity sheets. We have used these in our slides however some parents might wish for their child to complete these. The activity sheets can be printed off however this is optional.

The slides have been prepared and should be viewed as a presentation. The children can record their work in their own way on paper. For some of the activities they may choose to use objects around the house to help them.

Maths lesson 1 *Suggested activity to upload*

In this lesson the children are looking at fact families.

A fact family is a group of number sentences made up of the same numbers.

For example: If you know that $2 + 3 = 5$ you also know $3 + 2 = 5$ $5 - 2 = 3$ and $5 - 3 = 2$

We will be using the same video resources as last week. The worksheets mentioned in the videos are attached but these are optional.

Maths Lesson 2 *Suggested activity to upload*

In this lesson the children are going to be comparing number sentences.

Maths lesson 3

In this lesson the children will be looking at related facts.

This is one of the times when the children being really confident with their number bonds will help them. For example: If they know that $3 + 4 = 7$, then they also know that $30 + 40 = 70$.

ENGLISH

Writing - Instructions *Suggested activity to upload*

This week we are focusing on instructional writing.

In lesson one, the children will revise the features of an instruction text: title, list of what is needed, step by step instructions and bossy verbs (imperative verbs such as cut, mix, stick). In this lesson they will use imperative verbs to write special sentences called commands (sentences telling you what to do).

In lesson 2, (which is also the art/DT lesson this week) the children will read and follow instructions to make a simple butterfly feeder. They will need - a paper plate (or something similar), string/wool, colouring resources and old fruit.

The children will then choose what work they would like to do. They could write instructions on how to make their butterfly feeder or create a video explaining how to make a butterfly feeder. We understand that lots of children have been making their own projects at home and may even have been cooking. If they would like to write instructions/make a video for something they have been doing that would be great to see.

Reading Comprehension

Instruction comprehension - please choose the comprehension about the Greek food that best suits your child. (see English folder)

Spelling and Phonics

This week the children are learning the spelling rule of when to use the -y letter to represent the igh sound. They will learn that when a word ends in the igh sound the most frequent way to spell these words is with a y. Obviously there are exceptions to this rule but this is the 'best bet'.

SCIENCE

This week we will be learning about the life cycle of a frog.

You could log on to/sign up to explorify. It is a website we use to support teaching in science. There is an activity called 'odd one out' about baby animals. You will also be able to watch videos of tadpoles swimming and a butterfly emerging from a chrysalis.

GEOGRAPHY

This week we will be learning about Northern Ireland.

Key vocabulary: Northern Ireland, Capital City, Belfast, Giant's Causeway, County Antrim, Titanic Belfast, Carrick-a-Rede, Belfast City Hall, Lough Neagh, St Patrick's Day

Resource: Northern Ireland Presentation - google slides

Suggested follow up activities:

Make a poster to persuade people to visit Northern Ireland - you could make this on j2e - mix or using pens, pencils and paper. There is an example Poster template for your reference or use.

Look at a map of the United Kingdom. Can you find the capital city of Northern Ireland, Belfast? Looking at a map of Northern Ireland can you find County Antrim? That is where you will find the Giant's Causeway!

Choose a Northern Irish landmark and build it. You could use lego, junk modelling or whatever else you may have at home!
