You can also read books you have at home or on other apps. you use such as Teach Your Monster to Read.

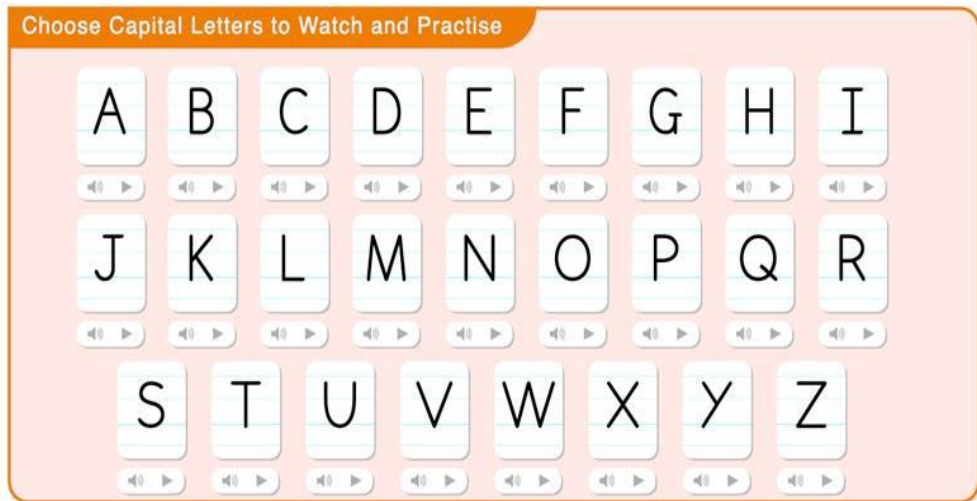


If you want to practise your phonics there are lots of games and lessons on Phonics Play.

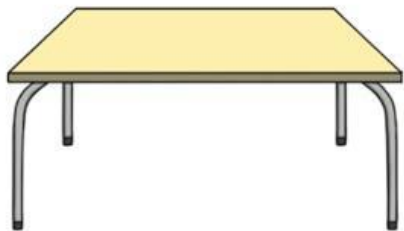

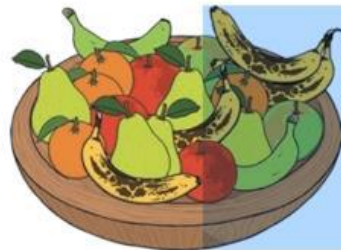
